unplanned fashion for repairs, resulting in a diversion of air emissions to the diverter stacks, and an unplanned shut down may result in the diversion of air emissions into the environment at a time and in conditions when an adverse effect on the environment may occur. Alberta Environment is of the opinion that a release of sulphur dioxide, hydrogen sulphide and particulates may occur, and the release may cause an adverse effect. Therefore, the Company shall submit a Plan and Implementation Schedule; implement the Plan; notify Alberta Environment at least 8 hours before undertaking any remedial work; and submit a final report within 7 days of completion of the remedial action.
