Alberta Environment received information regarding unauthorized grading activities on the lands. An excavator had been taken along the banks of the creek to remove garbage, and in doing so they had seriously damaged the banks of the creek such that the banks caved in; a portion of the tributary had been filled in to create an access road from one side of the lands to the other; neither channel had been properly engineered or constructed; fill material had been brought in to grade and level the lands, and during the grading work, soil fill and vegetative material had been pushed out on to the wetland. No approvals were issued by Alberta Environment for these activities. The placement of a bridge over the creek and the construction of the dirt road crossing over the tributary are watercourse crossings and do not comply with the requirements of the Code of Practice for Watercourse Crossings, and none of the notice requirements in the Code were complied with. Remedial works are required to restore the creek, tributary, and wetland to their pre-disturbance conditions, and to remove the improperly constructed watercourse crossings. The parties shall immediately cease all activities; submit and implement a Remedial Plan; provide 2 days notice of the commencement of the work in the Remedial Plan; provide written status reports every two weeks; and submit a final written report.

The rail cars contained lubrication oil, toluene, and bunker oil. Between 12-15 of the bunker oil rail cars ruptured or were punctured and began releasing bunker oil onto the ground and the rail car containing lubrication oil also ruptured and leaked its contents. The Company reported the release. An unknown amount of the substances were released onto the ground and the Company attempted to dig dykes and contain the released substances to the upland area, however the substances traveled away from the site and entered the water of Wabamun Lake, creating a plume in the water. The substances are causing, have caused, or may cause an adverse effect on the environment. The Company shall immediately take all necessary steps to contain the substances, remove the substances from all soils and water, and remediate any soil, surface or groundwater that has come or will come into contact with the substances to the standards set by the Director; provide daily written reports to the Director; provide daily reports to the general public; release the daily public reports from the on-Site Company Command Centre at Wabamun; and submit to the Director a final report within seven days of the completion of the remedial action completed in compliance with this Order.</p>
